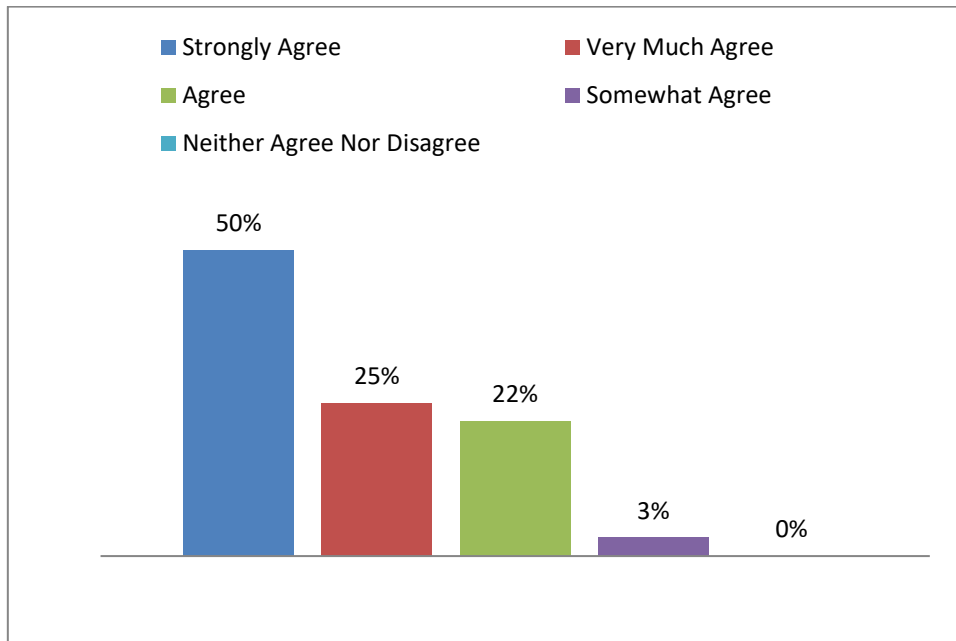

Chart 1: The course objectives were clear.

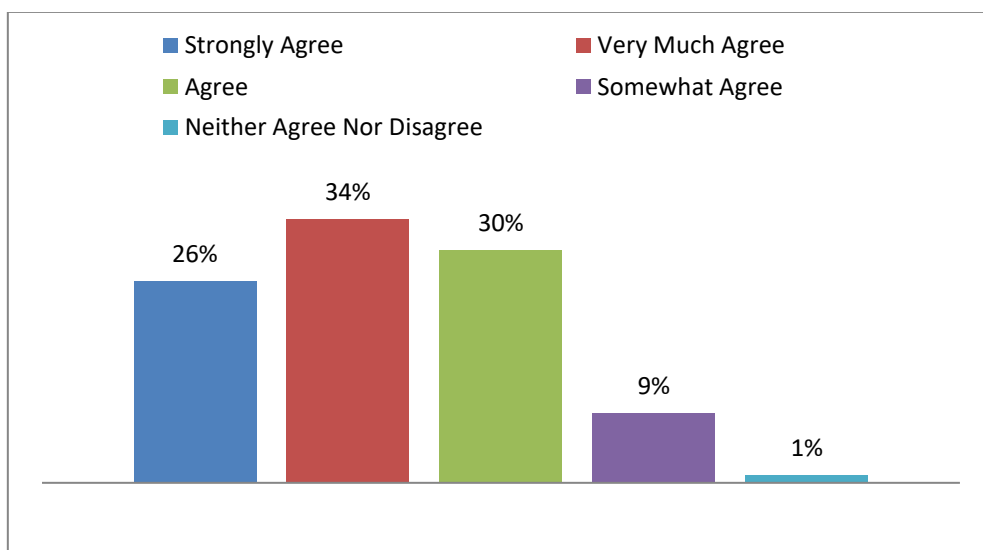


When the students were asked a question whether the “Course objectives were clear” then 50% of them responded “Strongly agree”, 25% “very much agree”, 22% “agree”, 3% “somewhat agree” and 0% “Neither agree nor disagree”. Thus it can be concluded that almost 100% of the students stated that course outcomes were fulfilled through the content delivery and practical exposure.

Action Taken:

- The students who have rated Average (3%) were called for a meeting, the reasons were discussed and the suggestions were sent to the concerned department.
- Departments were asked to give clarity about the course objectives to the students.

Chart 2: The subject workload was manageable

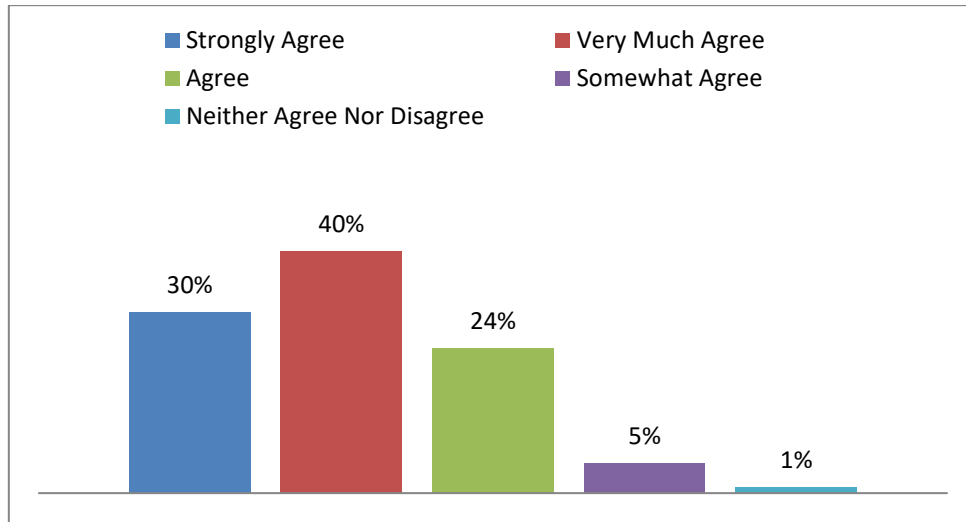


On asking the question whether the “**The subject workload was manageable**” then 26% of them responded “Strongly agree”, 34% “very much agree”, 30% “agree”, 9% “somewhat agree” and 1% “Neither agree nor disagree”. Thus it seems that 99% of students stated that the workload was manageable.

Action Taken:

- HODs were asked to take counseling session of those 1% students and make them understand how to handle the workload.
- Motivation session was conducted for the students by experts.

Chart 3: Course out comes were fulfilled

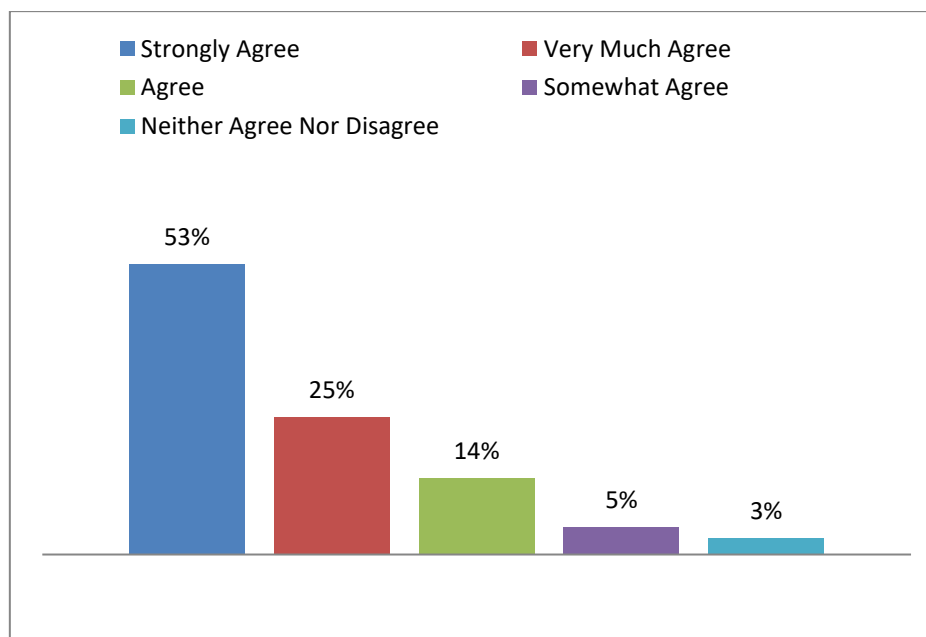


When the students were asked a question whether the “Course out comes were fulfilled” then 30% of them responded “Strongly agree”, 40% “very much agree”, 24% “agree”, 6% “somewhat agree” and 1% “Neither agree nor disagree”. Thus it seems that 99% of students stated that the course outcome was fulfilled.

Action Taken:

- Content beyond the syllabus was made mandatory for the quick learner on the grounds that the moderate students have demonstrated less intrigue.
- The syllabus has been revised keeping in consideration the feedback.

Chart 4: The learning and teaching methods encouraged participation

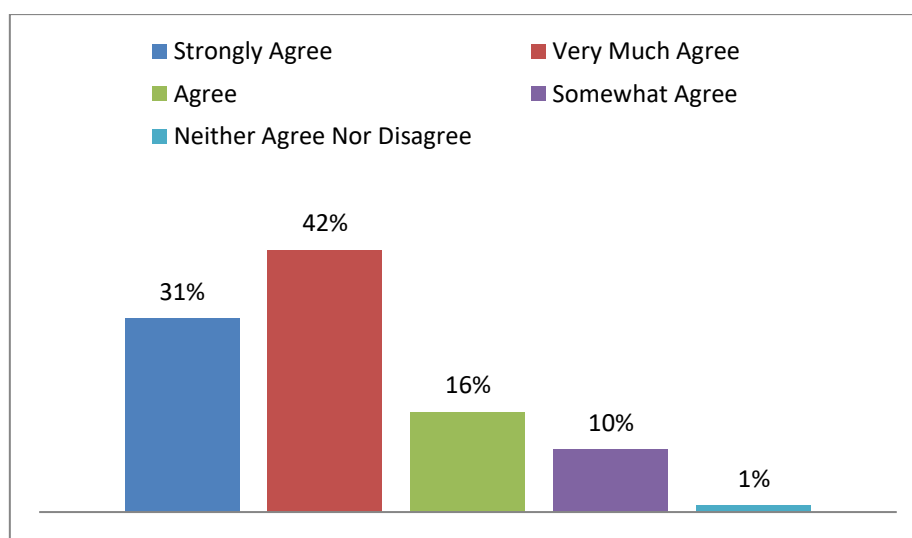


Total 53% of the students responded “Strongly agree” when they were asked a question whether the “The learning and teaching methods encouraged participation”, 25% “very much agree”, 14% “agree”, 5% “somewhat agree” and 3% “Neither agree nor disagree”. Thus 97% of students believed in the improved participation.

Action Taken:

- The student’s feedback that rated 3% “Neither agree nor disagree” were analyzed. Activities focussing on personality development were taken up to make the students self- reliant that inculcate positive attitude and facilitate to acquire the capability of right decision making.
- The departments were instructed to conducting Workshops and arranging Motivational Talks for the students on regular basis.

Chart 5: The provision of learning resources in the library was adequate and appropriate

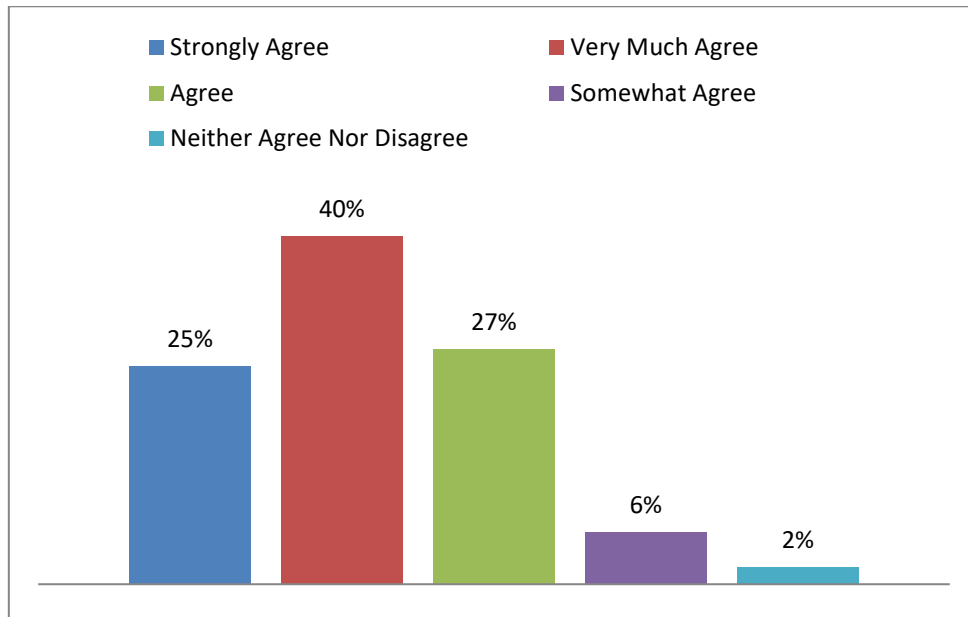


When the students were asked a question whether the “The provision of learning resources in the library were adequate and appropriate” then 31% of them responded “Strongly agree”, 42% “very much agree”, 16% “agree”, 10% “somewhat agree” and 1% “Neither agree nor disagree”. Thus 99% of students appreciated the adequacy.

Action Taken:

- The student’s feedback who has rated 1% “Neither agree nor disagree” were analyzed and requirement from them has been taken and forwarded to the concerned committee for procurement.

Chart 6: The methods of assessment were reasonable

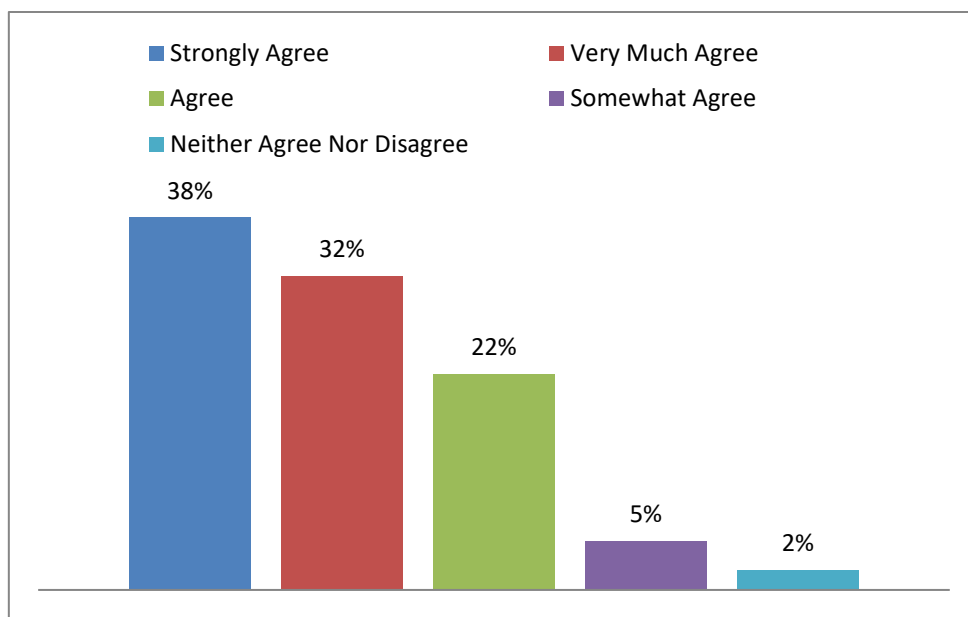


25% of the respondents answered “Strongly agree”, 40% “very much agree”, 27% “agree”, 6% “somewhat agree” and 2% “Neither agree nor disagree”. Thus 98% of students are satisfied with the assessment methodology.

Action Taken:

- The feedback of 2% students were analyzed and their suggestions were taken and forwarded to the competent authorities for necessary steps to be taken.

Charts 7: Feedback on assessment was helpful

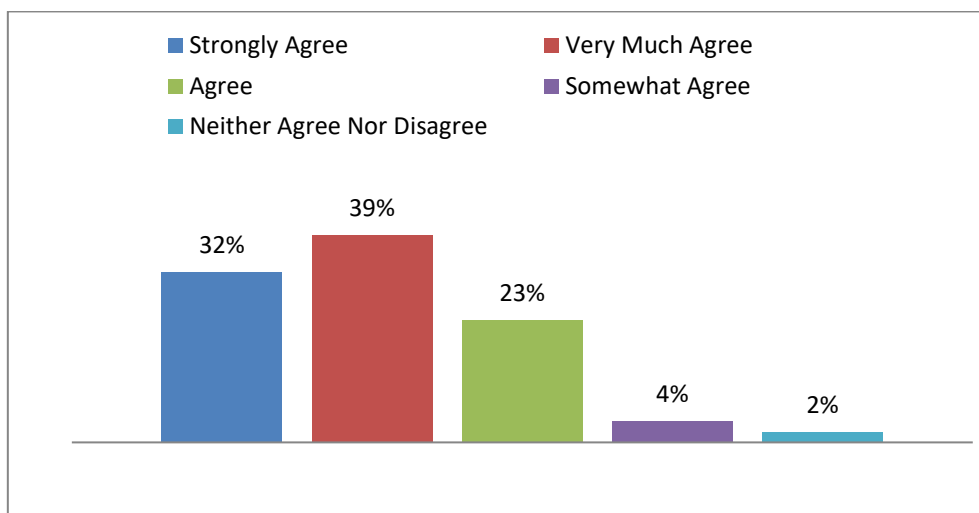


38% of them responded “Strongly agree”, 32% “very much agree”, 22% “agree”, 5% “somewhat agree” and 2% “Neither agree nor disagree”. Thus 98% of students realize that feedback on assessment was helpful.

Action Taken:

- The students who have rated 2% “Neither agree nor disagree”, the reasons were taken in meeting and analyzed. Counseling has been given to those students.

Chart 8: Subject topics are relevant to current industry requirement

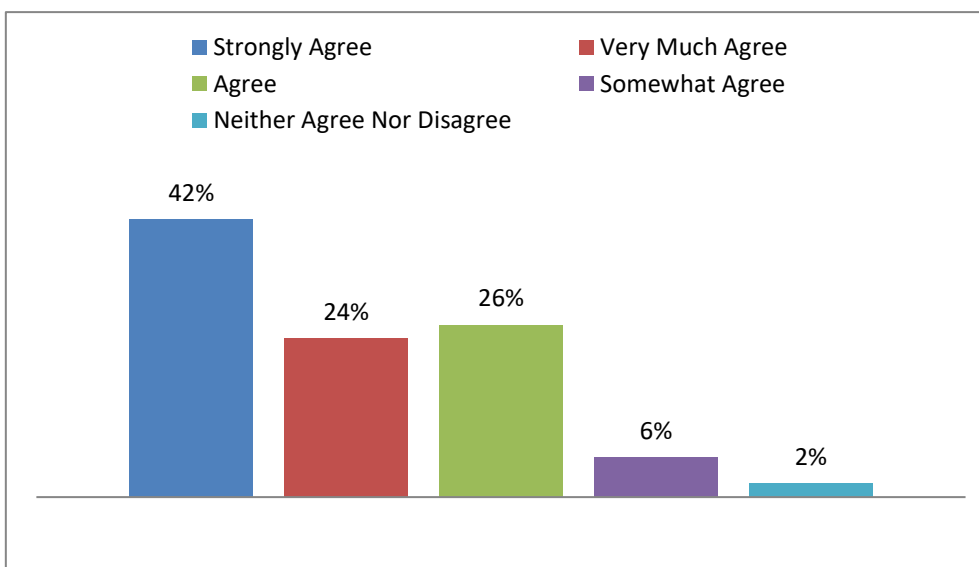


When the students were asked a question “*Subject topics are relevant to current industry requirement*” then 32% of them responded “Strongly agree”, 39% “very much agree”, 23% “agree”, 4% “somewhat agree” and 2% “Neither agree nor disagree”. Thus it seems that 98% of students stated that their subject topics are relevant to the industry requirement.

Action Taken:

- The experts from industry visited the university, interacted with students and we have taken suggestions from them regarding our curriculum and advised HODs to review the syllabus as per the industry needs.
- The HOD’s were instructed to revise the curriculum and to add more electives to meet the students’ demands.

Chart 9: How do you rate the list of experiments for the laboratory courses in relation to real life applications

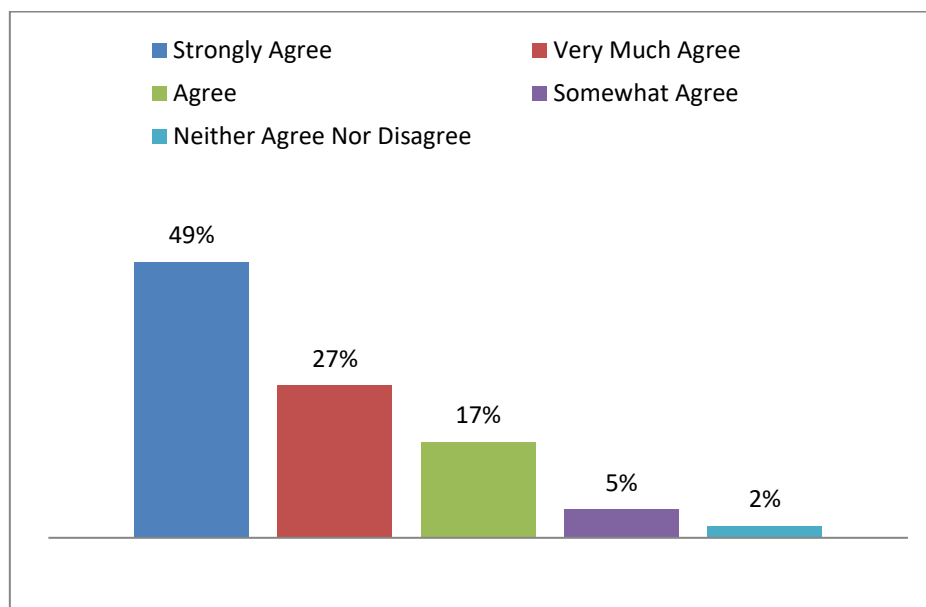


When the students were asked about it then 42% of them responded “Strongly agree”, 24% “very much agree”, 26% “agree”, 6% “somewhat agree” and 2% “Neither agree nor disagree”. Thus it seems that 99% of students appreciate its real life applications.

Action taken:

- The students who have rated 1% “Neither agree nor disagree” were called for the meeting.
- The concerned faculties were asked to improve the list of experiments where improvement is sought.

Chart 10: How do you rate the course outcomes for the laboratory courses

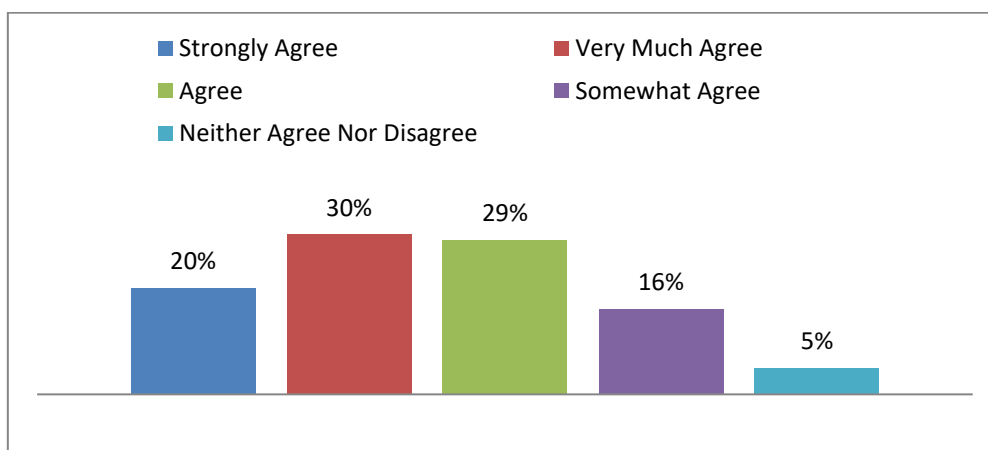


When the students were asked a question that “**How do you rate the course outcomes for the laboratory courses**” then 49% of them responded “Strongly agree”, 27% “very much agree”, 17% “agree”, 5% “somewhat agree” and 2% “Neither agree nor disagree”. Consequently 98% of students do appreciate it.

Action Taken:

- The students who have rated 2% “Neither agree nor disagree” were called for the meeting.
- The requisite modifications have been done in the syllabus of Lab subjects for acquiring theoretical knowledge along with its practical applications as well.

Chart 11: How do you rate the evaluation scheme designed for each of the course

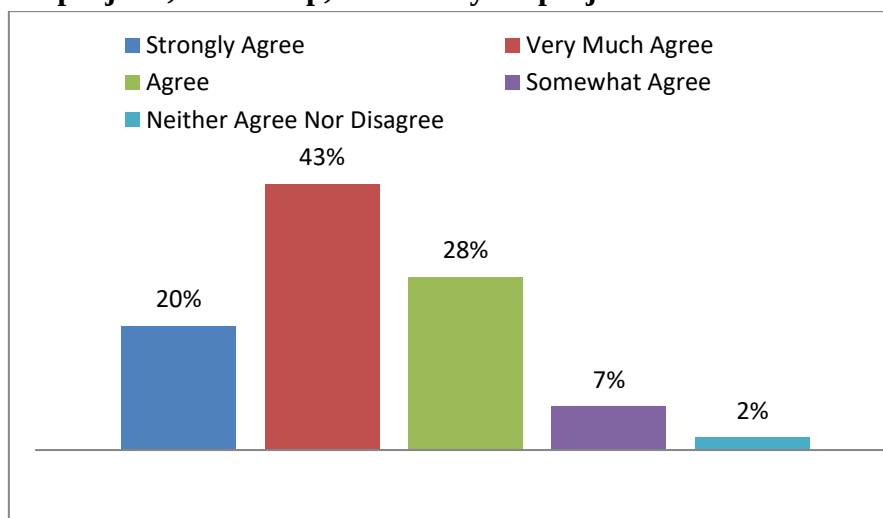

Action Taken:

Chart 12: How do you rate the opportunities provided for value added courses, mini –projects, internship, and final year project

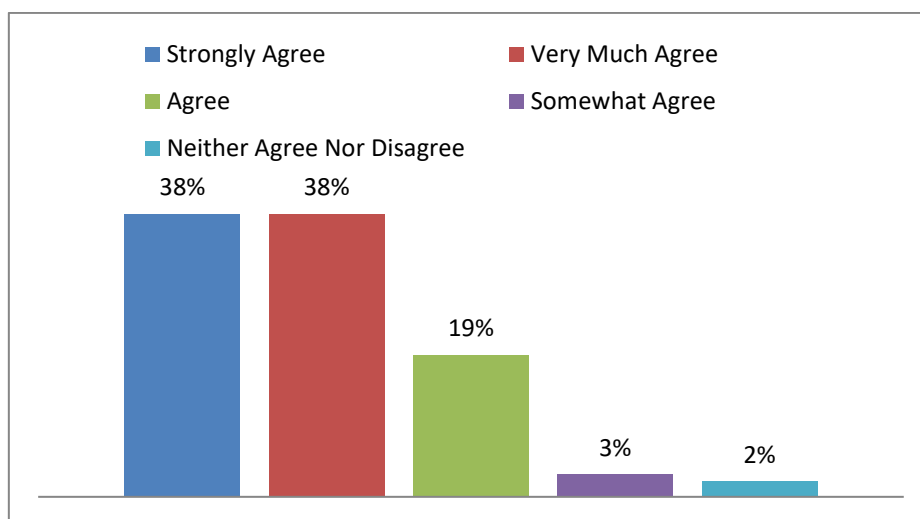

- Project mentor forecasts weekly on the projects.
- Identifying the students who need extra mentoring in their project work.
- Connected with industry experts for better mentoring on the real life projects.

Chart 13: There is sufficient collection of books, journals and reading material at the college Library

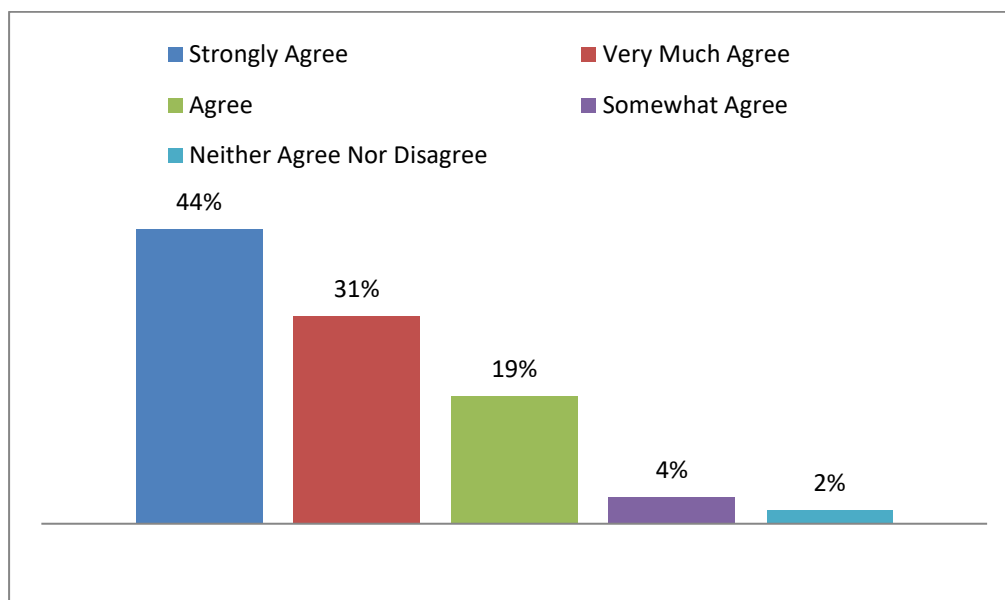


When the students were asked a question about the library then 38% of them responded “Strongly agree”, 38% “very much agree”, 19% “agree”, 3% “somewhat agree” and 2% “Neither agree nor disagree”. Thus 99% of the students are happy with the resources available in the library.

Action Taken:

- The students who have rated 2% “Neither agree nor disagree” were asked to give their requirements and the list has been sent to the department head for further process of procurement.

Chart 14: The Library Staff is co-operative and helpful

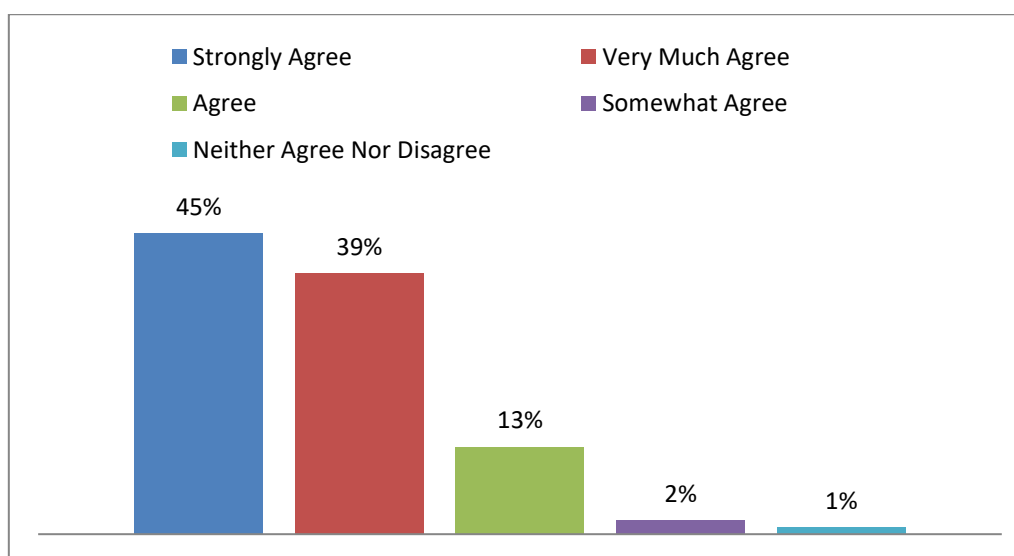

Chart 15: There is sufficient available Reading space in the Library

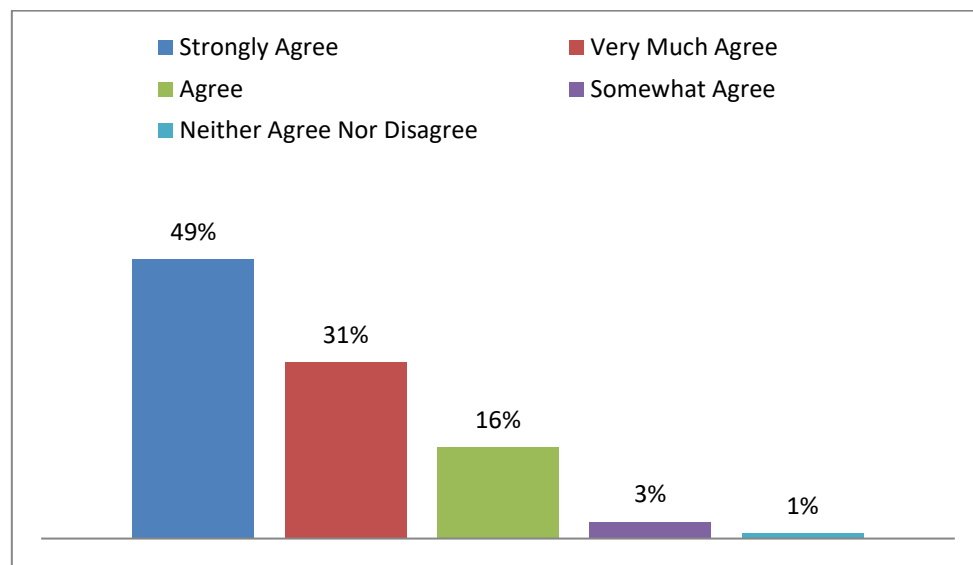

Chart 16: You are able to access Internet (WI-FI) as and when you require

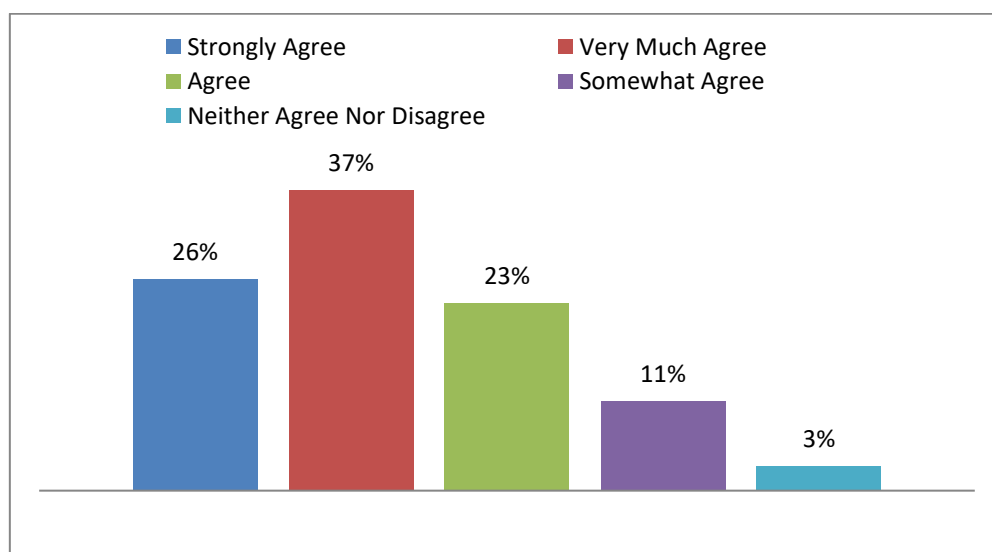

Chart 17: You are aware of the functioning of the placement cell in our University



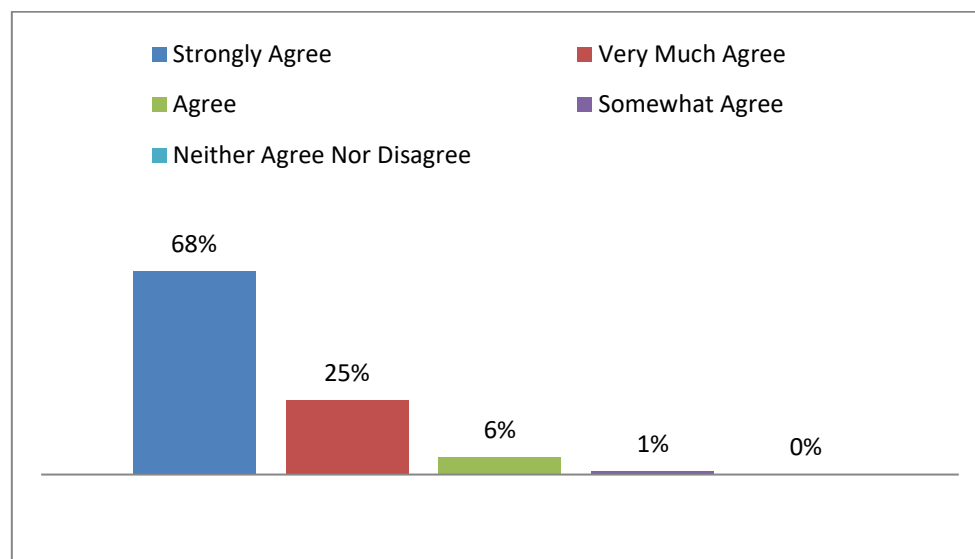

Action Taken:

- For those 3% who have responded “Neither agree nor disagree” students training and placement department has been instructed to conduct sessions, course wise so that each and every student must be aware of the functioning of Training and placement department.
- Trainings were arranged by the placement cell and communication skill and soft skill were Strengthened. Activities that will enhance the Communication skills of the students were encouraged.
- Pre-placement trainings were given Mock interviews and tests were conducted. The students were given guidance to how to prepare for bank exams, service commission exams and adequate classes was provided for the same

Chart 18: Sufficient Classrooms, reading rooms, toilets are available

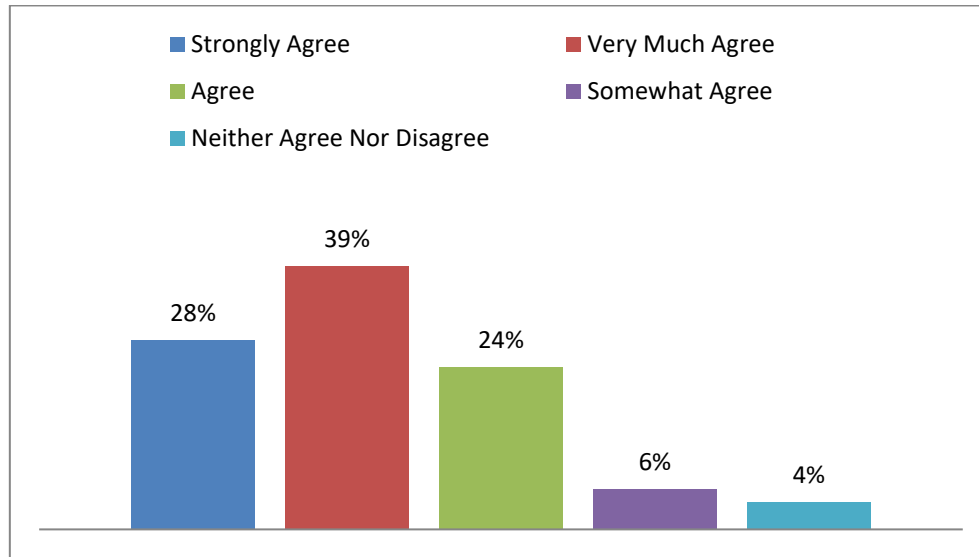


When the students were asked about it then 68% of them responded “Strongly agree”, 25% “very much agree”, 05% “agree”, 01% “somewhat agree” and 0% “Neither agree nor disagree”. Action Taken:

- The Administration department was requested to look into the observations made by those 1% of the students and sort the issues if any.

Chart 19: You are satisfied with sports facilities available in University

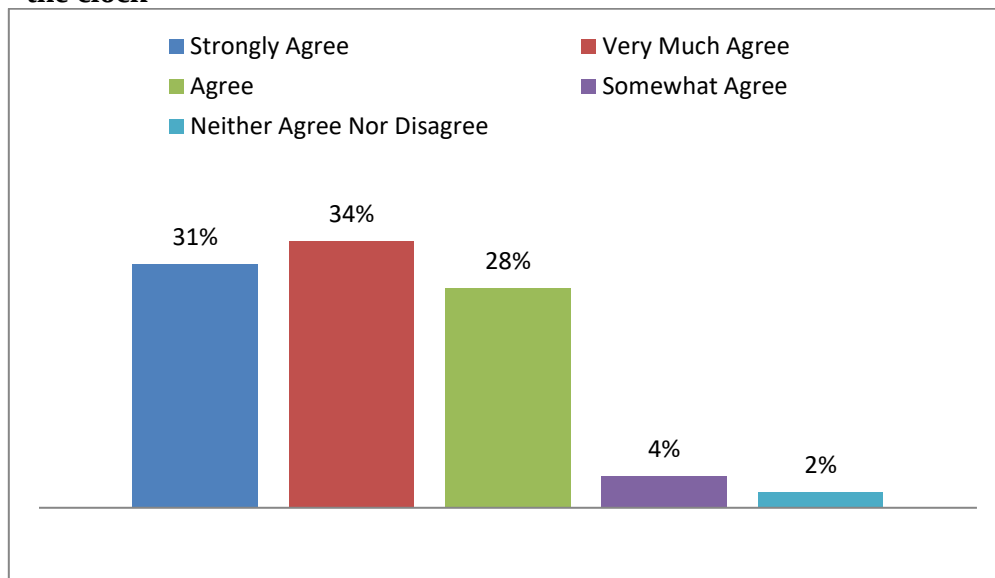

Chart 20: You are satisfied with the medical facilities that are available round the clock

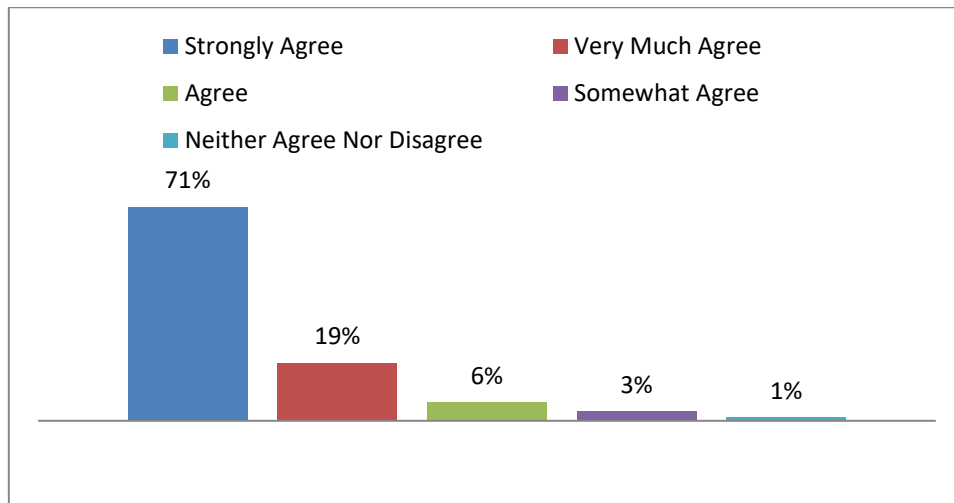

Chart 21: Classrooms/labs/workshops are cleaned properly

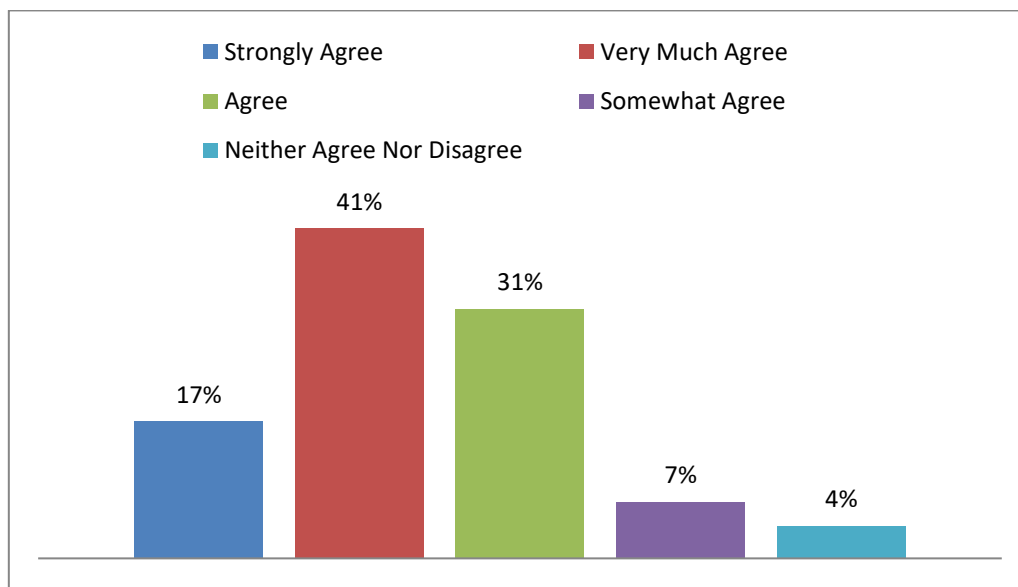

The Administration department was requested to look into the observations made by 1% of the students and instruct the housekeeping staff accordingly.

Chart 22: The toilets are cleaned properly and regularly



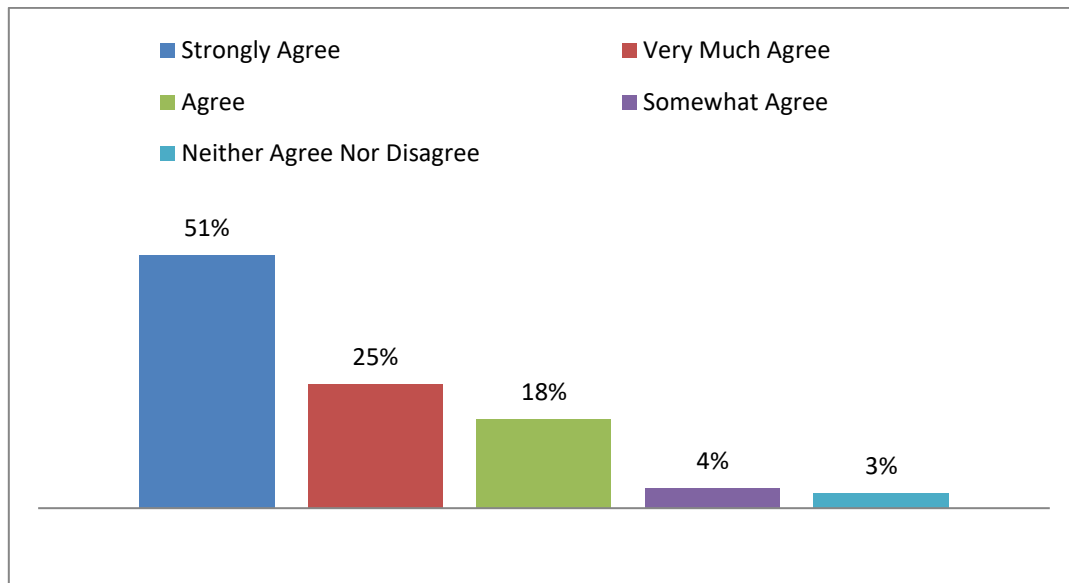

Chart 23: You are provided with Clean and cold drinking water

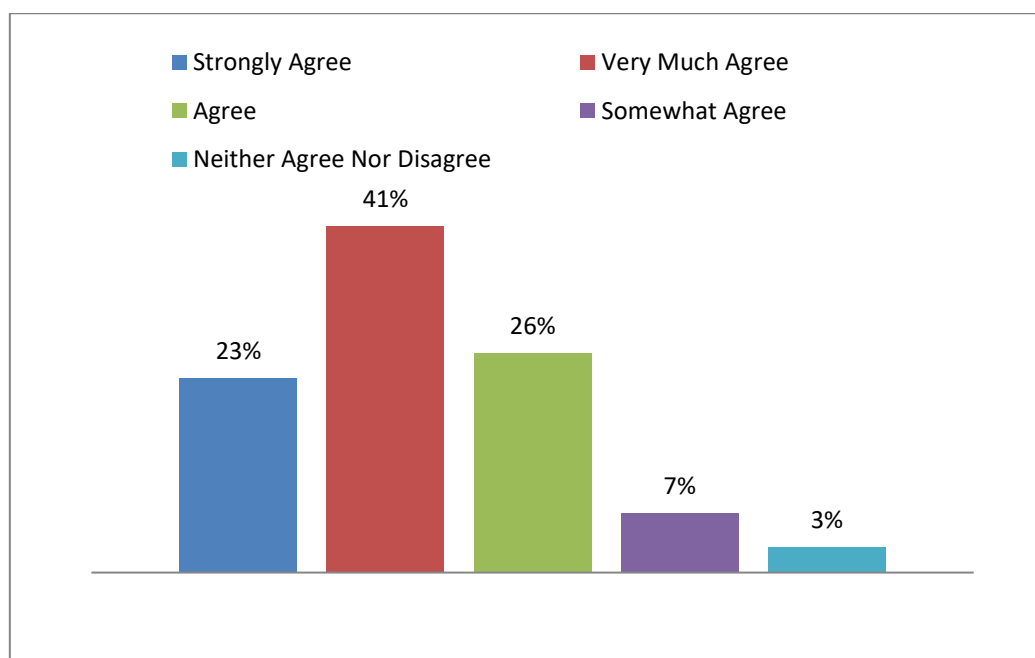

Chart 24: You are satisfied with Student Amenity Centre (Mini Market) present in your Campus

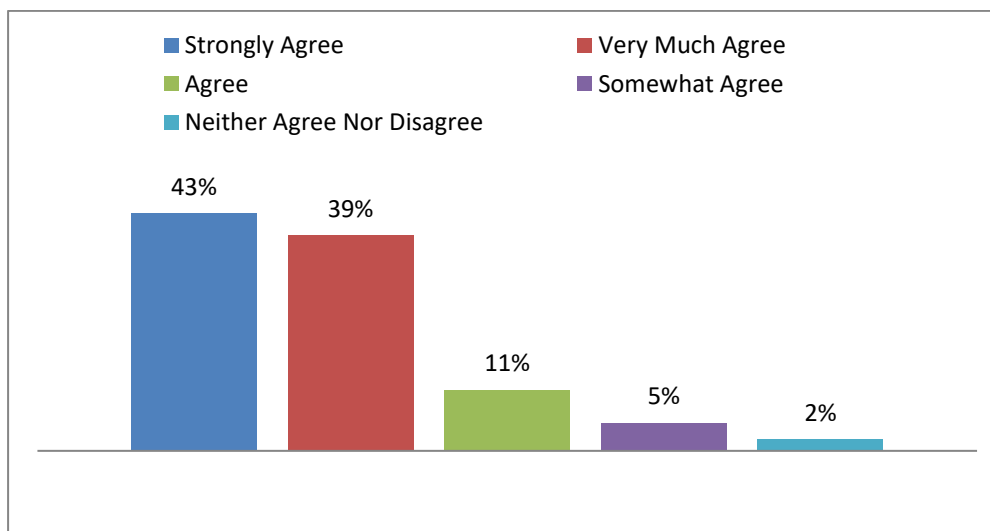

Chart 25: The feedback process is fair and unbiased

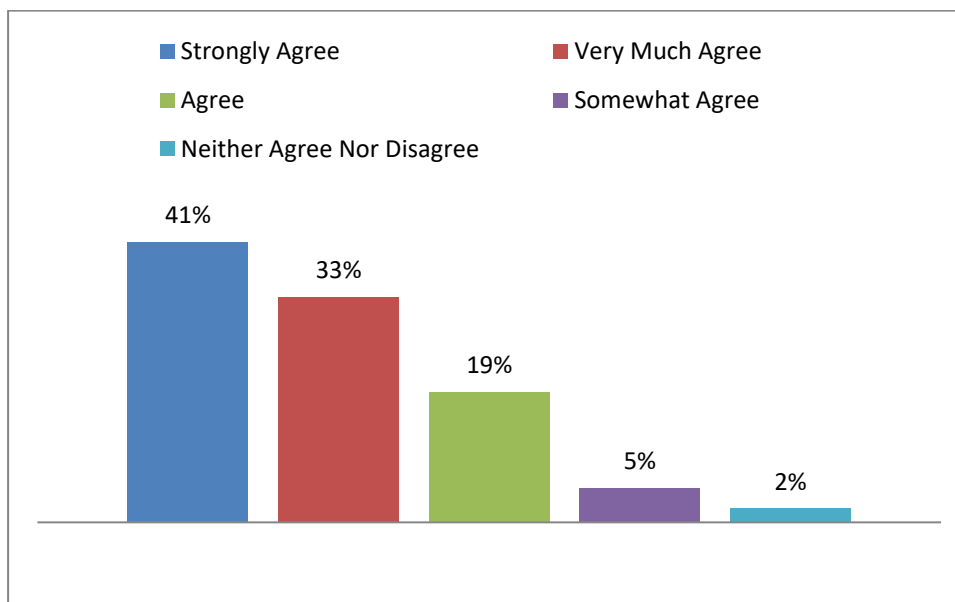

Chart 26: The teacher uses modern teaching aids, handouts, suitable references, power point presentation, web resources etc

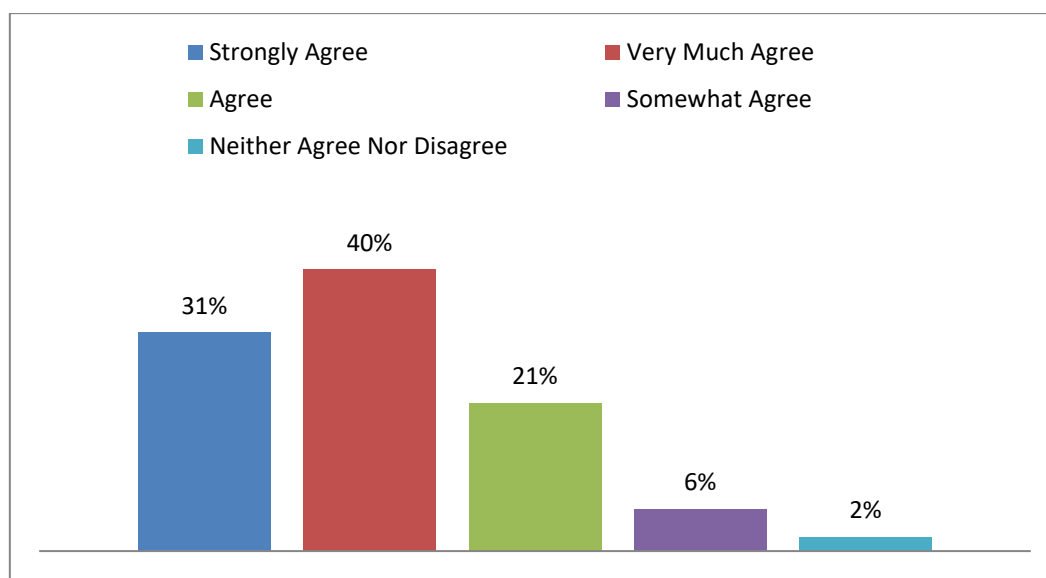

When the students were asked about the “Syllabus balance between theory and practical applications” then 31% of them responded “Strongly agree”, 40% “very much agree”, 21% “agree”, 06% “somewhat agree” and 02% “Neither agree nor disagree”. Action Taken:

- The reasons were collected during the meeting with the 2% students.
